Estacada's Broadway is fast falling back into its former state of untidiness, since Clean-Up-Day, much refuse is now scattered on it, including numbers of envelopes with the names of the recipients. There are also a few newly broken sidewalk planks in evidence on other streets although most of them adjoin property owned by non-resident people.

Prosperity seems to be coming the way of Eastern Clackamas, for with the outlook for a big fruit crop, new road building in country and city and a big new store to be opened by June 1st, it shows money being spent now.

The missing of the regular bi-weekly livestock shipping date from the Estacada Stock Yards, does not imply that the hogs are all gone from this country, but is due to the between season, with plenty of young swine for later delivery.

Hardly a day passes but the need of a commercial organization is not felt in Estacada. Letters are received constantly from the Portland Chamber of Commerce, railroads, private parties and other sources, asking for information regarding this part of the county.

A community today without such an organization is seriously handicapped, for parties looking for business or land locations, do not care to even investigate a locality that is not progressive enough to maintain a commercial club.

One of the best advertisements that such a club could get right now, would be to have a supply of "THIS WAY TO ESTACADA" sign boards erected throughout the county.

With such united backing, undoubtedly something could be done to organize an industry, to utilize the valuable clay deposits on the F. J. Harkenrider property. This clay has received the endorsement of the Ceramic Dept. of the Oregon Bureau of Mines and Geology, and its merits should be brought to the attention of outside clay workers, if it cannot be locally financed.

The Portland papers last week chronicled the financial troubles of one of Portland's big mail order houses and its subsequent absorption by a competitor, but "we should worry," and here's hoping more of them go the same route.

Good Fruit Outlook

Reports are daily coming in from all sections of the promise of bumper fruit crops this year. If the blossoms are an indication, the trees will be heavily loaded and the prune crop now seems assured, for there is small danger of frosts from now on.

Crowds Attend Movies

The Saturday afternoon free moving picture shows in Estacada, held under the auspices of the Estacada merchants, are drawing crowds into the city on those days. Last Saturday's matinee performance at the Family Theatre brought out a record attendance of Estacada visitors and the evening performance was as well attended by the townspeople.

A Welcome Extended

Rumor is responsible for the report that R. M. Townsend, Property Agent of the P. R. L. & P. Co., is seriously considering returning to the soil and is quietly investigating land values in the vicinity of Estacada.

While he has not definitely decided upon the location, he is considering about a ten acre piece, suitable for poultry raising. Information regarding land prices or settings of eggs should be furnished to him by this community, before some district with a commercial club locates him elsewhere.

Mr. Townsend's vast experience with Clackamas county's lands has made him yearn for the soil, where he can don overalls, count his chickens and possibly represent his district in the legislature.

Proposed Line To Sandy

Pres. Griffith of the P. R. L. & P. Co., in a recent talk before the state railroad commission, stated that the company planned to build a railroad either from Cottrell on the Mount Hood line, or from Boring on the Cazadero line, 18 miles through Sandy.

The proposed extension is being urged by wealthy lumber interests, as about 400,000,000 feet of fine timber would be opened up by such a road.
