New Engine Plow Arrives

W. R. Reid received a new two bottom gang plow this week, the latest product of the Oliver Chilled Plow Works, designed especially for small tractors.

The plow has one truck wheel in the rear and is attached rigidly to the draw bar of the engine in front so that it can be operated from the seat or backed up in case it meets an obstruction. Mr. Wilson, Portland manager for the Oliver people, spent a day in Garfield assembling the plow and trying it out with the Samson Sieve Grip Tractor on the state farm.

Concrete Improvements.

Buyer C. E. Lucke, last Monday, shipped the twelfth carload of livestock from the Estacada stock yards. This car contained 43 hogs, 15 sheep and 5 calves.

To facilitate and expedite future buying and shipping, all farmers are requested to notify R. M. Standish of Estacada of any livestock which they may have for sale. In order to arrange a shipping and buying date, previous data regarding the livestock must be obtained. It will greatly help matters if farmers will notify the Estacada agent of what stock they have that will be ready for the buyer within the next sixty days, so that plans can be made accordingly. If the growers wait until announcement is made of a shipping date, it merely delays that date.
