### Lost Amphibians Return

John Githens, the well known Alspaugh trout and frog culturist, reports the return this week of his herd of imported bull frogs, from "no one knows where" except possibly some scientist. The frogs disappeared from their usual haunts at the approach of winter last fall, and whether they have been hibernating nearby, deep in the bowels of the earth or spent the winter at Palm Beach, is a mystery.

If part of them leave the family pond next winter, it will be minus their hind legs, which are worth about \$4. per doz. and that is the end of the business that John is interested in.

### Drinking Vessel For Hens.

The best drinking vessel for the poultry house is a large, heavy weight galvanized refrigerator pan, which holds about a pail of water. Such a pan, to be efficient, should be placed on an elevated platform about one and one-half feet from the ground. Over the pan can be constructed a slanting roof or guard to keep the birds from perching on the edge and soiling the water. Such a pan is relatively cheap, easy to clean, easy to fill and is not readily injured even if the water freezes solid.

### Value of Trap Nests.

Trap nests give us a system of weeding out which no other method affords. This system means a saving of food and room. A dozen selected layers will give a greater profit than double the number in which are good, bad and indifferent. Is it not worth the little extra labor necessary to attend to these nests? I have proved the fact that I can secure 20 per cent more eggs with 25 per cent fewer hens by breeding only from my best layers.—M. K. Boyer.
