Fair Money Amounts To \$1,824.26

According to the announcement of Secretary of State Olcott this week, \$1,824.26 is the amount Clackamas county will receive this year as her share of the amounts apportioned to the counties of the state, under the law providing for the levying of 1-20 of a mill on the taxable property of the state, for the support of county fairs, land product shows or livestock exhibitions.

This money shall be used for premiums for such exhibitions, and such part as is not expended shall revert to the general road fund.

Clackamas' general road fund will receive about the same amount this year, as prospects indicate that the East Clackamas County Fair will receive.
