#### Falls Off Water Wagon



## Dog Killing Ends in Court

A crowd of residents from the Eagle Creek and Barton districts were in Estacada last Saturday afternoon, where they witnessed the justice court hearing, in the case of the State of Oregon vs Carl Young of Eagle Creek.

The conplaining witness P. Douglass of Eagle Creek, represented by his counsel E. W. Bartlett of Estacada, is suing the defendant Carl Young for the alleged shooting and killing of a hound dog, which occurred on the premises of the defendant's brother, during the pursuit of a coyote by the dog.

The defendant was represented by David E. Lofgren of Portland.

Justice Devore decided that the case should be brought before the grand jury at their next session.

#### Many Cows Ill

A serious epidemic of "bloody murrain" as it is technically called, is current among many cows in this part of the county. Already several cows, including two belonging to Geo. Armstrong of Garfield, one to F. J. Harkenrider and one to Mrs. Matt Patterson of Estacada, have died.

This disease is supposed to be caused by a parasite which infests green feed after a prolonged rainy spell and is taken into the stomach of the cow, causing a fatal form of dysentery. The disease is catching and all precautions should be taken to quarantine the sick animal.
