### Clackamas County Statistics

The Oregon Almanac for 1915 which has just been issued by the Oregon State Immigration Commission gives some interesting figures and facts which are herewith quoted.

Of the 158,186 horse power of water power developed in the state of Oregon, 107,085 is developed in Clackamas county. These streams rise in the foothills of Mt. Hood and Mt. Jefferson, passing through the most fertile upland country.

Clackamas county is estimated to have standing merchantable timber under private ownership and in National Forest Reserves to the amount of 15,808,976,000 B. M. feet of some of the finest timber in the west, principally high grade fir.

Clackamas county contains several of the best developed farm and orchard districts in the state of Oregon, and some of its wild-west mountain wildernesses.

The area of Clackamas county is 1964 square miles, nearly as large as the state of Delaware. A large area of the county is in National Forest.

Clackamas county ranks first in production of potatoes and clover, fourth in oats, the yield being heavy; fifth in hops, fourth in apples, pears, prunes and raspberries; first in quinces, grapes and strawberries; second in cherries; third in blackberries and fifth in English walnuts. Although so small portion of the area is actually farmed, the class of farming done is so successful and profitable that Clackamas county has one of the highest average ranks for quantity of desirable products.

The population of Clackamas county is 38,819 or 19.7 persons to the square mile, 70 per cent. American born and the balance almost wholly composed of the highest class of European people. —Oregon City & Clackamas County Publicity.

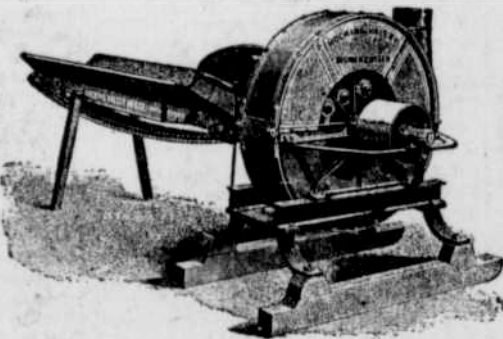

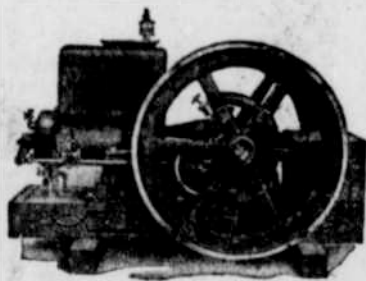
