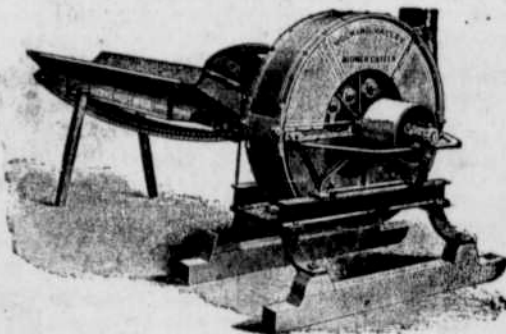

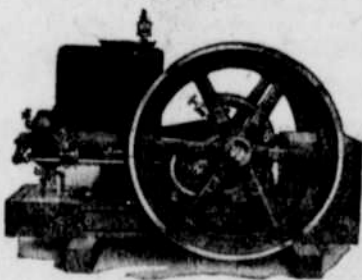

#### Disasterous Fishing Trip

Friday fishing trips will hereafter be eliminated from the schedules of John Ferguson and the editor of Estacada, owing to the bad luck that seems to be current on that day.

These fisherman left last Thursday evening with Ferguson's team, for Bissell, where they remained over night as the guests of Mr. and Mrs. Adolph Wiederhold.

Friday morning they fished the upper waters of Eagle Creek from the Bohemian trail to the Rim Rock country and then attempted to return home via the hog back ridge running west from Round Top Mountain. After a hazardous climb they came out on an abandoned trail, which they supposed was the old Miner's Trail leading into Bissell, but after following it for several hours, ended up above the abandoned Beech cabin in Section 2 S. R. 5 E. Not having had anything to eat since 5 A. M. the travelers were well tired out and extra hungry and had an eight mile walk to the nearest house in upper Dover, where they arrived about dark.

From this place they phoned to Mr. Wiederhold asking if he would drive their team down to the Henry Johnson place in George, where they would get it later in the evening, after crossing the canyon of the North Fork of Eagle Creek.

Even with the expert knowledge of district fire warden Ferguson, the pair were lost again in the darkness in the jungle of timber and brush and from danger of injuries from falling over logs and rocks in the North Fork canyon, were forced to build a fire and wait until daylight; arriving in George the following morning.

In the mean time Mr. Wiederhold had met with a serious accident, while driving from Bissell the night before. The neck yoke tie strap broke, allowing the yoke to telescope up the pole, causing a bad runaway, which resulted in a tip over of the buggy near the Fred Lin's place in George. But for the late hour at which Fred Lins was abroad and the arousing of Ed Harders and a friend nearby, the result of the accident might not have been ascertained until morning.

Mr. Wiederhold, who is an experienced horseman was unable to check the team under the conditions and they ran into a stump, pinning him against it. When found he was unconscious and was taken to his home, where Dr. Adix found that he was suffering from a bad crushing of the left side, a seriously cut head and hand. At last reports, the patient was getting along finely, but the injury will confine him to his bed for several weeks yet.

Had it not been for the serious accident to Mr. Wiederhold with the dangerous injuring of one of the horses, the lost fishermen would have considered their adventures a huge joke, but under the conditions it was a far from humorous trip.
