While it is purely a matter of taste, an exhibit which tastefully presents the products in their natural state, is far more attractive tnan one using stiff, regulation bundles of grain, arranged in geometrical designs. Clackamas county won first prize last year at the state fair and much of the attractiveness of the exhibit was due to the decorative scheme with the natural grains and grasses.


