No Quail Shooting This Year

Deputy Game Warden, B. S. Patton of Estacada has called attention to a couple of changes in the game laws for the coming season.

Formerly it has been lawful to kill Mountain or Oregon quail during the open season, but unlawful to kill Bob White or California quail. Owing to the danger of killing the protected birds by the hunters not being able to distinguish between the several species, all quail are hereafter protected.

The open season for deer, which formerly began August 1st, will begin August 15th this year and extend until Oct. 31st inclusive.

Garbage And Can Collection

In the want-ad columns will be found the advertisement of a local farmer, who will call semi-weekly at Estacada homes and take away all garbage free. He will also remove tin cans and other non-burnable rubbish, if in boxes or barrels, a slight charge will be made for this latter service.

Parties, desiring regular garbage collection, notify the Progress office and if a sufficient number of residents desire this convenience, the service will be regularly installed.
