Order Not Effective Here

The order issued several days ago by Postmaster General Burleson, prohibiting the use of bicycle and motorcycles in rural delivery service, will not effect any of the carriers of this district. In announcing his order, Mr. Burleson holds that vehicles of these types do not have the carrying capacity necessary for the parcel post service and do not afford enough protection for the mails in bad weather. The order will not go into effect until January 1, 1916, and will effect about 8000 carriers, who now use bicycles and motorcycles.
