**Order Not Effective Here**

The order issued several days  
ago by Postmaster General Burle-  
son, prohibiting the use of bi-  
cycle and motorcycles in rural  
delivery service, will not effect  
any of the carriers of this dis-  
trict. In announcing his order,  
Mr. Burleson holds that vehicles  
of these types do not have the  
carrying capacity necessary for  
the parcel post service and do  
not afford enough protection for  
the mails in bad weather. The  
order will not go into effect until  
January 1, 1916, and will effect  
about 8000 carriers, who now use  
bicycles and motorcycles.

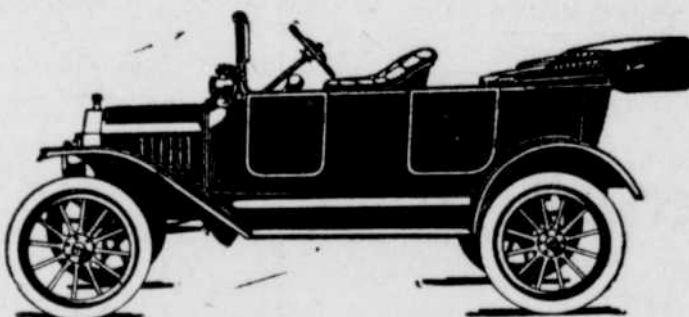
