More Butter Laws

J. D. Mickle, dairy and food commissioner, states that the words, "One Pound" or "Two Pounds," as the case may be, must be printed upon the butter wrappers, instead of "16 ounces" or "32 ounces" as heretofore used. This is in accordance with the regulations of the Federal government, which have been adopted by the dairy and food commissioner's office. The state law requires that all dairy butter law requires that all dairy butter must be labeled with the name of the maker, place it is made (post office address,) and the net weight. Mr. Mickle's letter says, "The law requires that this information shall be printed on the wrappers.

The law also provides that butter shall not contain more than 16 per cent. of moisture, nor less than 80 per cent. of pure milk fat. Persons receiving butter from outside the state must at once notify the commissioner.
