Crossed the Range

The last of the automobile tourists who made the Clackamas Lake trip week before last, returned to their homes in Estacada last Thursday evening, having made the return trip largely on "shank's mares" and a couple of W. A. Jones'.

The original party, comprising four auto loads, left Estacada a week ago last Friday, intending to visit Clackamas Lake, via Government Camp and Clear Lake, to remain over Sunday. One of the autos broke down before reaching Government Camp, and the remaining machines by doubling up, landed the entire party at Clackamas Lake, Saturday night.

Sunday was spent at the Timothy Meadows camp and early Monday morning, the J. W. Reed, Frank Ewing and R. H. Currin cars with their passengers started for Estacada via Wapinitia, Hood River and Portland, arriving Tuesday afternoon, having enjoyed a scenic trip.

The other five members of the party, including Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Ferguson, Mr. and Mrs. R. M. Standish and P. F. Standish, returned down the western side of the range, via Oak Grove, Three Links and the Clackamas River trail, walking most of the way, until horses were obtained. They reached Estacada in a bedraggled condition Thursday night, but thoroughly enjoyed the trip.

More Butter Laws

J. D. Mickle, dairy and food commissioner, states that the words, "One Pound" or "Two Pounds," as the case may be, must be printed upon the butter wrappers, instead of "16 ounces" or "32 ounces" as heretofore used. This is in accordance with the regulations of the Federal government, which have been adopted by the dairy and food commissioner's office. The state law requires that all dairy butter must be labeled with the name of the maker, place it is made (post office address.) and the net weight. Mr. Mickle's letter says, "The law requires that this information shall be printed on the wrappers.

The law also provides that butter shall not contain more than 16 per cent. of moisture, nor less than 80 per cent. of pure milk fat. Persons receiving butter from outside the state must at once notify the commissioner.
