With the present first class merchandising facilities in Estacada, the city's business streets on a Saturday present a busy appearance. Last Saturday afternoon, thirty-five autos and farm wagons were drawn up along Broadway between 2nd and 3rd streets at one time and the sidewalks were bustling with shoppers.

Complaint is still being received from some of the farmers, against the poor hitching facilities offered by Estacada. This complaint is justifiable to a large extent, but until a herd law is passed in the city, a hitching rack or tie barn, with its attendant feeding stalls would offer too much attraction to the town's cows.

Portland is advertising Buyers Week, from August 9th to 14th and inviting everyone to visit the city at that time. This is intended largely for the retail merchants and their buying, and only in case Estacada merchants cannot furnish the goods, should the local consumers buy elsewhere.

The Oregon Sportsman League is asking for the support of all sportsmen's organizations to try to offset the present ruling of the Southern Pacific Ry., in their charging for the transporting of the State's fish car, "Rainbow," which formerly had been handled free over their lines.

This car last year made several trips to Estacada and vicinity over the P. R. L. & P. lines from which many thousands of trout fry were liberated locally.

Inasmuch as the propagation of the state's fish supplies, is of the utmost value to the state and an attraction to the tourist and visitor, it is surprising that the S. P. Co. would take this action.

Looking at it from the railway's standpoint, the P. R. L. & P. Co., who for several years past have handled the "Rainbow" over its lines free of charge, has decided to join with the S. P. company and hereafter charge for transportation.

The charge for carrying the fish car is 10 cents per mile, when on fish distribution work, this includes five passengers. In other

words the car will cost the State Game and Fish Commission \$7.20 round trip from Portland to Estacada.

The railroads feel that they are entitled to some small remuneration for this hauling, especially as they are the largest individual tax payers in the county and state.

The sentiment of the community is reflected in editorial utterances and its enterprise in the news and advertising columns.

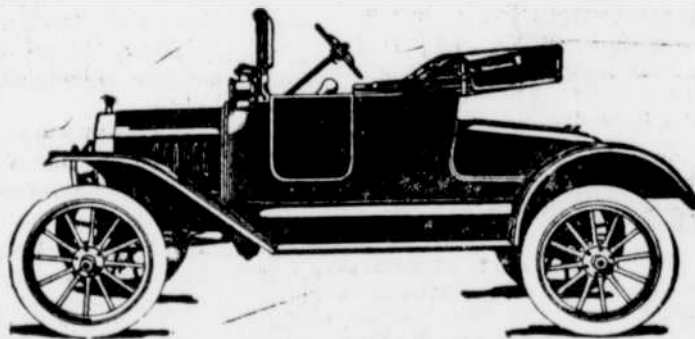
The country weekly is the great instrument for community up-building.
