The party was entertained at a delightful chicken dinner by Mr. and Mrs. Adolph Miller of George and after visiting at the Stevens and Joyner homes, proceeded to explore the wilds of Eagle Creek canyon in the vicinity of Millers' Bridge, planning to return to Garfield via the upper road.

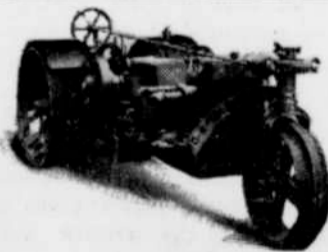
