This organization has already made a reputation for Garfield Country Sausage in Portland and at present cannot fill the orders on hand. This sausage is standardized and made up according to a Dutch recipe and the demand for it at 20c per lb is unlimited.

The association besides marketing general produce, is making a good name for itself in the handling of poultry, with the consumer assured of young and tender chickens only. The rules make it compulsory that no member sell any chicken of over two years of age, unless the bird has been especially milk fed with the meat made tender.

There is always a steady demand for guaranteed first class produce and if the Garfield members will stick strictly to their rules regarding quality, they will prosper.
