Livestock Buyer C. E. Lucke was in Estacada last Tuesday. He will be here again next Saturday, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, buying stock for a carload shipment to be made Wednesday, providing a sufficient quantity is obtainable.

The local agent now has listed about sixty head of stock, being largely cattle and sheep, and expects that more will be added to the list before the buyer arrives.

Mr. Lucke will call at George next Monday, as several parties there have cattle for sale. Will all growers having cattle, which they wish to sell, arrange to bring in the stock from the range and have them in the barn yard, where the buyer can see them?

Saturday, Sunday and Tuesday will be spent in buying through Garfield, Currinsville, Springwater, Viola and other sections.
