To the Editor Estacada Progress:
As your paper is "devoted to the interests of eastern Clackamas County" and is making a worthy endeavor to benefit the community it represents, I am taking the liberty of addressing an open letter to you hoping it may be of some assistance in making known to the proper authorities and taxpayers the crying need of better roads in this portion of the county. Statements appearing now and then during the past year have led me to believe that perhaps Clackamas County will soon break away from old time conditions and traditions and take it upon herself to build roads—good roads. Her highways have made a name for themselves in the past and present, but I may add that the name is nothing to be proud of, as most of us know.

It now seems—and I have a news item from Oregon City as my authority—that the County Court is not satisfied with the supervisor system and that the county is losing money by it every year. There are some Clackamas County taxpayers who positively know, and have known for some time, that they, personally, have thrown money away time and again under the present system. To district the county, as suggested, with competent men in charge, should materially help in pulling the road work out of a rut that has already been in vogue too long. Proper road building—the only kind to consider today—is a science and the day is long since past when any man is capable of making or superintending these modern roads.

The cry for Clackamas County, particularly eastern Clackamas, from now on should be good highways for its farmers—roads that can be traveled with ease and comfort any time of the year. Such roads would not be a constant wear and tear on the nervous systems of man and beast, and they would accomplish wonders in building up and maintaining a prosperous community. Take our eastern Clackamas country, for example. Naturally a beautiful section with excellent soil conditions, why does it not progress more rapidly? Simply because of its awful road conditions. I personally know of roads that are worse now than they were ten years ago. And yet I—and others—have been taxed for their improvement; Where has the money gone?

If the County Court wishes an expression of opinion regarding any change from the present manner of conducting road work, I trust the taxpayers will readily come forward and say they emphatically stand for improved conditions. I believe the County Commissioners are for better methods. I know if they traveled some of the important eastern Clackamas roads as the farmer travels them they would immediately become impressed with the bold fact that good highways are in order without delay, and perhaps they might see, from actual observation, that this eastern portion of their county is really entitled to more consideration from headquarters than it has secured in the past.
