#### More Valuable Cows Succumb

Last Monday, two more valuable cows, belonging to Ben Bullard of Estacada, died from the epidemic of "hemorrhagic septicaemia."

Word was immediately sent to State Veterinarian Lytle, but owing to other calls coming first, he cannot be in Estacada for a few days, when he will probably vaccinate more of the exposed cattle.

About sixty days ago, Ray Miller of Viola had the state veterinarian call to see his cows, which at that time were suffering from this same disease, as well as a number of his neighbors' cattle. The veterinarian gave Miller a prescription, which was used on all exposed stock and with the best of results.

The diseased cattle, except in cases where the disease was too far advanced, recovered and the infected stock at once threw off the diseased matter from the bowels and stomach.

The prescription is on file at the Estacada Pharmacy and has been successfully used by a number of farmers on cattle that were not supposed to have contracted the disease at that time. Anyone wishing to obtain this medicine may do so, although its beneficial results are not guaranteed.

#### Fire Departments To Contest
