Trout Fry Ready Soon

The following letter from the office of the State Fish and Game Commission, guarantees that this part of the county will be able to obtain a sufficient supply of trout fry for liberation this summer.

State of Oregon Fish and Game Commission, Portland, Oregon,

My Dear Mr. Standish:—

Your letter of August 6th arrived in due time and would have been answered at an earlier date, only I have been out of the city a good deal and after returning have been on the sick list.

It is our intention to try and take care of your section in furnishing trout fry for your streams. As you are no doubt aware, we have feeding ponds at Eagle Creek in which we are holding Rainbow trout and Eastern Brook. These fry are to be liberated in the streams in that section. We also have been furnishing funds for the propagation of steelheads at the River Mill U. S. Bureau station. I have no report on the number of fish on hand there, but what remain are to be distributed near there.

With reference to the fish at our Eagle Creek Feeding ponds, I am writing Mr. Kitzmiller to confer with your club with reference to ascertaining into what streams these fish are to be planted.

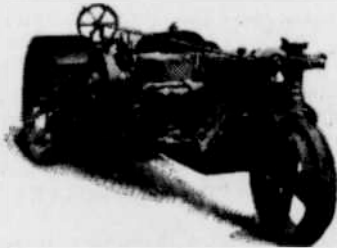

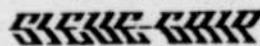
