As this is about the first shipment on the hoof of livestock made from this section by private individuals, the results are awaited by many stock growers and the Progress will be pleased to give further space to the shipment, if the shippers will advise this office.

### Tie Between Eugenic Babies

Word was received Tuesday afternoon that an error had been made in the measurements of Wallace J. Guthrie of Estacada at the eugenics contest last week, and with the correct measurements recorded, it gives him a percentage of 98, being tied with Victor Forman of Barton for first place. This correction was made through Mrs. Bayley of Portland, who was in charge of the measurements.

### Eastern Clackamas To Be Advertised

The Portland Railway Light & Power Company have this week reserved a space at the coming Manufacturers and Land Products Show to display the agricultural products of this part of the county, adjacent to their lines.

This show opens Oct. 25th, continuing until Nov. 13th, and thousands of people will view the exhibits, many of whom are looking for locations in Oregon.

The railway company wishes to have the cooperation of the residents of this territory in making this exhibit a success. Agricultural products will be needed at that time, as the produce now being shown at the county and state fairs will be worthless by the time this show opens.

R. M. Standish of Estacada and Roy Meyers of Eagle Creek are in charge of this display and will welcome suggestions, exhibits, etc.

A. J. Brown of Alspaugh has greatly improved the appearance of his home by the addition of a wing, including two rooms and a thorough painting of the buildings.

### Many Growers Disappointed

For the past three weeks the Progress office has been in receipt of many calls from the growers of livestock in this vicinity, asking when the next carload would be shipped from the Estacada yards and when Buyer Lucke would call on them.

It is a discouraging condition of affairs at present and the raiser of first class livestock has to suffer owing to the scarcity of similar grade stock among his neighbors.

Over 200 head of hogs, cattle and sheep were listed in the past two weeks and Buyer Lucke was unable to obtain a sufficient number of good animals to make up a carload. The majority of the cattle offered were below par, being largely dried-up milk cows and in the few cases where the cattle were satisfactory, the market price was too low to interest the seller. Fully 50% of the hogs classed below par and with the present low price of \$6.15 for tops f. o. b. Estacada, many raisers naturally preferred to butcher, as the market for dressed pork has been better for the past two weeks than the live market.

Many growers are greatly disappointed at this condition, having held their stock over for two weeks awaiting a shipment and cannot afford to hold them longer.

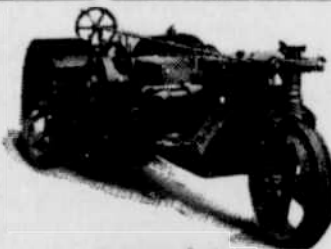
There is no one to blame and the Progress, which was instrumental in locating the stock yards here is especially disappointed and will welcome suggestions as to a remedy for this state of affairs.

The buyer can only pay according to the Portland market and when the market is glutted with undersized and underfed pork, the price suffers accordingly. As to the cattle market, it is in the same condition as all other markets, namely the first class product brings the top price and inferior stock brings little profit.

Our neighboring section of Molalla is today considered one of the best hog raising sections of the Northwest and shipping from that point and Canby has been brisk, with three to half a dozen carloads per week of high grade hogs.

One solution of this condition is for the growers of swine to get together at a meeting, through their Grange or other organization and arrange to shut up and fatten their hogs at the same time, then a sufficient number of first class hogs can be gotten together at one time to fill one or more cars.
