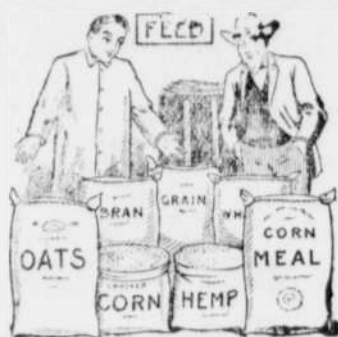

Every effort was made this week to get together a carload shipment of livestock, but only 32 hogs could be obtained at the 6c price and but a dozen head of cattle were available.

Many farmers were forced to butcher their hogs last week, as they could not afford to hold them until a carload could be gotten together. If the butchered animals could have been added to the list for this week, a carlot could have been obtained. The price for dressed pork is proportionately low, being from 8 to 8½c in Portland.

Of this week's listings, the buyer would have been forced to cover almost one hundred miles, as a few offerings were to be had in Elwood, Dodge, Upper Garfield, George, Eagle Creek and way points, with the majority in Lower Garfield.

Cooperation in the various neighborhoods is going to be the only solution of this problem of getting together carload lots.
