Road Budget Meetings

Each road supervisor will have to employ a legal advisor, book-keeper and stenographer if he wishes to perform the duties of his office according to the revised road laws of the state.

All supervisors received a form notice Wednesday from the county judge, as follows: "If you wish to call a meeting for the levying of a special tax this year it will be necessary for you to fill out the blank spaces, as to names date, etc., in the enclosed form of notice and have the same published in a newspaper at least 20 days before the date set for the meeting. You should publish this notice very soon in order to call a second meeting to make the tax levy at the proper time. The notices for this second meeting will be sent you later with further instructions. H. S. Anderson"

Insurance For Farmers

The State Industrial Accident Commission of Salem have now established a department to allow of the farmer and his helpers to obtain accident insurance at the same low rate, as offered to manufacturers.

The rate for farming operations in general farming including all operations incident thereto is 2% of the payroll. Threshing, clover hulling, hay and straw baling, 4%; prune drying, 1%; wood cutting, 3%; and clearing without blasting, 3½%; with blasting, 5%; road work, 3%. In addition to the above from the employer, he is required to collect from the workman and remit with his own contribution one cent a day from each workman insured.
