### Reservoir Elevation Ascertained

Through the courtesy and efforts of Engineer Hal Rands of the Oregon City Water Commission, assistant engineer White has determined the exact elevation of the Estacada reservoir, being 701 feet above sea-level.

Doubt was expressed as to whether the water from the South Fork pipe line would flow into the reservoir, in case Estacada obtained water from this source. In as much as the intake of the South Fork line is at an elevation of about 730 feet and the water is forced over the Springwater divide at an elevation of 702 feet, this question is answered.

As to whether Estacada buys water from Oregon City depends entirely on the outcome of the negotiations now under way between the Estacada City Council and the neighboring water commission. As soon as Oregon City has its water completely installed, the commission will find time to consider the local application.

The residents of Oregon City are now using the South Fork water, although all of the city's main are not yet handling it, but will be in a few days.
