Remember that the child's craving for sweets is a natural one and should be gratified. The injurious effects of pure chocolate and candy are due to their being eaten in excess or before meals, which will destroy the appetite for the meal. If the teeth are properly cared for they will not be injured by sweets.

Scottish crisps always tempt a child's appetite and are easily and quickly made: Beat one egg until light, add gradually one-half cupful of sugar then add two-thirds tablespoon of melted butter, one cupful rolled oats, one-third teaspoon salt, one-fourth teaspoon vanilla.

Drop mixture by teaspoonfuls on thoroughly greased inverted dripping pan one inch apart bake in moderate oven until delicately browned. Remove from pan as soon as taken from oven, using case knife. Seeded raisins may be placed on top of the cakes or, one may use two-thirds cup oats and one-third cup shredded coconut.
