While nothing definite has been heard on the subject here, the Trade News Service of New York, a daily market and commercial news service in the east, under date of Oct. 14th states: "J. R. Newton, Hood River and G. A. Cobb, Yeon Bldg. Portland, contemplate erecting canning plant at Estacada, Oregon."

Announcement is made of the Farmer's and Home-maker's Week and Rural-Life Conference at the Oregon Agricultural College, January 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 1916.

The value of this short course to the farmers and farmers' wives of Oregon is inestimable. 2106 people attended this course last year and the coming course will probably see a large increase in attendance.

The exercises of this important week consist of brief, pointed, instructional lectures by leaders in our State and from other states on subjects of vital importance to farmers, home-makers, engineers and all industrial workers. Demonstrations in the laboratories, dairy, domestic science kitchens, stock barns, gardens, orchards, green-houses and fields. Opportunities for testing the merits of many different types of farm tools and machinery. For judging breeds and types of livestock and many other equally as valuable and instructive features.

There is no charge for the lectures or conference and reduced rates will prevail on all railroads.

The O. A. C. has announced a list of Station and Extension Bulletins which are now ready for distribution, a copy of this list may be obtained at the Progress office.

The Progress has from time to time gathered a large assortment of these valuable bulletins and has this week given them to the Civic Improvement Club library in Estacada, where they may be obtained for public reference.

**County Knocks Out \$25,000
Injury Suit**

A personal injury suit of C. F. DeFord of Barton for \$25,000 against Clackamas county was knocked out of court Wednesday by Judge Campbell who upheld a demurrer filed by District Attorney G. L. Hedges. The case was similar to the suit of Rapp against Multnomah county in which the supreme court held in effect last week that a county could not be sued for personal injuries. The Multnomah county case was carried up from the circuit court, where the county lost. DeFord was injured while working at the gravel pit.
