To Increase Feeding Ponds

Petitions are being circulated by members of the Estacada Rod & Gun Club and others, asking the State Fish & Game Commission to increase the capacity of the present Eagle Creek Trout Feeding Ponds from 400,000 to 1,000,000 fish.

Inasmuch as there are about 200 miles of trout water adjacent to this district, with natural trout food plentiful, this increase is warranted. Furthermore, this district is centrally located as to population, with Portland anglers and tourists within easy distance and probably 40% of the present fishing in the state is done within a radius of 30 miles of Estacada.

It is hoped these petitions will be signed by all residents and that the present good work of keeping the local streams well stocked, will continue.
