#### 26 Loads In 26 Days

C. E. Lucke has been the busy bustling buyer for the past sixty days, with what is undoubtedly the state record as a hog buyer, having bought, loaded and shipped 26 carloads of livestock during the 26 working days of October. These shipments were made from Estacada, Canby and Molalla.

Lucke shipped a carload of hogs from the Estacada yards, Monday morning, and another carload Wednesday.

Among the largest sellers of hogs were F. J. Harkenrider, L. Hale, Crawford Bros., Hugh Jones, Peter Ruhl, Henry Trapp, N. Taylor, H. Schmidt, G. Brown, W. F. and J. H. Looney and C. T. Davis.

The price paid on the first carload was on a basis of \$5.75 tops at Estacada with a slightly lower price on the second shipment.

Buyer Lucke is purchasing hogs largely and if the local growers wish to dispose of the medium grades or poor cattle, it can be done in a cooperative shipment. Or at any time the growers wish to begin cooperative shipping on hogs and cattle, Buyer Lucke will be glad to help assemble and make the first shipment and the Progress office will aid in any way possible.
