



## DODGE BROTHERS As Desert MOTOR CAR Stages

Fleet of 18 are used on route that lies through Imperial Valley

Each car averages 1,000 miles per week and company is enthusiastic over performance.

Out in the Imperial Valley of California, a fleet of 18 Dodge Brothers motor cars are used as stages. They are known as the "Pickwick Stages," because of their starting at the Pickwick Theatre, San Diego. Their route lies across a portion of the California Desert and each car averages about 1,000 miles per week. Various makes of motor cars were tried out by the Pickwick Stage Company, which operates the line. About six months ago the first Dodge Brothers car was purchased and subjected to many tests on the route. The success was so striking that several more were bought and this number has been added to, until there are now 18 in use, and more to be bought within a short time.

According to Mr. Bayes, one of the proprietors of the company, the upkeep on these cars has been remarkably light, and within a year he expects to operate Dodge Brothers cars only.

### Two More Mutual Companies Quit

Last week's announcement of the suspension of business of the Beaver State Mutual and the Portland Mutual Fire Insurance companies, has set the local insurance situation up side down.

There were about twenty-five Estacada policies in these two mutuals, which are now being transferred by the policy holders into stronger companies, with the preference being for straight old line companies, in preference to mutual insurance.

It has always been a temptation on the part of a property holder to take a risk in an unreliable company, in order to save a few cents on the rate. The recent experience of several Estacada policy holders has been a sad one, with unpaid fire losses amounting to several thousand dollars, and the insuring company failing.
