#### E. C. & S. P. Co. Formed

The last week saw the organization in Estacada of a new company, called the Estacada Contracting & Stone Picking Company, Ltd., with Warren Barr, President and Secretary and Bob Morton, Vice-President and Treasurer.

The company has already borrowed some contracting equipment, including one wheel-barrow, one pick and two shovels but expect later to add six donkeys engines, three derricks and two clam-shell steam shovels.

Pres. Barr reports that business conditions are fast brightening, regardless of the general depression in financial circles. His company recently closed negotiations with A. E. Sparks, owner of "Sparks Parks" in South Estacada, for the removal of all rock, gravel, and pebbles from the property.

Vice-Pres. Morton reports the present contract will probably keep their company busy for three years at least, as Chief Engineer Barr has discovered that the size of a rock above the ground line, is not always a true indication of its hidden bulk, in some cases a six inch protuberance may be the end of a substratum of lava deposit.

Owing to scarcity of labor at this time, the president and vice-president of the company are each in charge of a gang of workmen, while the secretary and treasurer are doing the manual labor.

Spectators or others interested in watching this company handle these excavations are requested to obtain permits from the office on Broadway.
