On the invitation of A. F. Slop-er of Logan, it was agreed to hold the next meeting of the league at the Logan Grange Hall, on Wednesday afternoon, February 16th and all taxpayers are invited to be present.

An interesting and instructive program will be given at this meeting and an invitation is being extended to Judge Anderson and the other members of the County Court to be present and take part in the program.

At least two hundred taxpayers should attend this meeting and a big delegation from Estacada, Barton, Garfield and other sections are already planning to make the trip. Several local auto owners have offered their machines to help haul the crowd.

Before the adjournment of the meeting, J. W. Reed announced that Hon. Geo. C. Brownell and others from the lower end of the county would hold a political meeting at the Family Theatre, Estacada, Monday afternoon, January 31st. All voters of both sexes are urged to be present, as this will be the first real old fashioned political meeting of the coming campaign.
