110 Hogs Make A Trip

To Erect a Tent In Winter.

Instead of using a rope bridge, tents should be set in winter with a pole between two trees or supported on forked sticks, and the tapes along the ridge should be tied to this pole, says Al. Outdoors. If the tent has no tapes run the pole through the tent from end to end, and support it at each extremity with a forked pole. Better still are two forked poles at each end, the bottoms of which are spread far apart. When the tent sags it can be tightened by drawing the bottom close together and thus raising the ridge. Pole-spread apart in this way also add much to the stability of the tent in a wind. While this method requires five poles instead of three it is nevertheless the best way to erect an A tent. It will be difficult to drive stakes in winter, but logs, to which the ropes may be tied, will serve nearly as well.

Shrapnel Cartridge Cases.

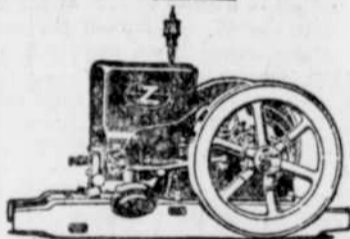

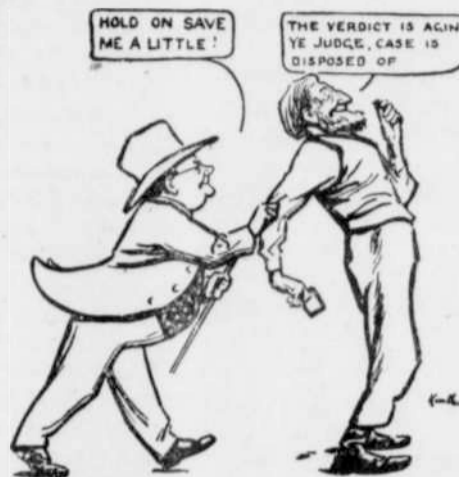
