County Will Collect \$819,318 In Taxes

With the upward tendency of tax levies, both special and general, coupled with the new high school tuition fund, the taxpayers of Clackamas County will this year be called upon to pay the sum of \$819,318.00.

These are the figures compiled by Assessor Jack, collection of which will begin this week. A comparison of the 1915 and 1916 taxes, shows an increase of \$34,940.35 for the coming year.

The delinquent tax list comprises 1365 names, amounting to nearly \$50,000 of 1915 taxes, of this sum over \$30,000 is outstanding on the O. & C. land grants.
