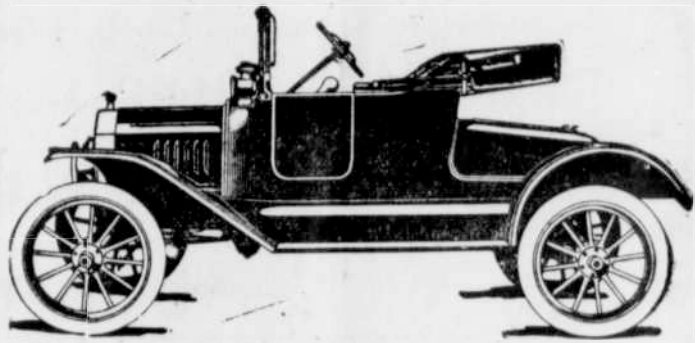

Jury Disagree

In the case of the State vs Paul Lightner of Eagle Creek, which came up for trial before Justice of the Peace Devore, in Estacada last Monday afternoon, the jury disagreed, standing four for acquittal and two for guilty.

The complainant was Dave Hoffmeister of Eagle Creek, who charged the defendant with assault and battery, following an altercation relative to a land dispute. The complainant was represented by attorney Bartlett, while the defendant pled his own case.

The jury consisted of Messrs. Lovelace, Wooster, Page, Park, Heiple and Standish.
