The News is glad to be able to report that County Judge Anderson, who has been ill for the past thirty days, is now able to be about again and is attending to his duties this week, although his physician has advised him to take a much needed rest.

The report is current in Oregon City and elsewhere, although possibly unfounded, that Judge Anderson is contemplating resigning from the office, owing to ill health. The News wants to go on record right here, that it hopes there is no foundation for this rumor, for a successor who could as efficiently handle the work, one who is as honest and willing to do his best, would be a hard man to find.

If the Judge did resign, it probably would mean an appointment by the governor to fill the vacancy until January 1917 and in the meantime the county would have to elect a permanent Judge.

Undoubtedly several county men feel confident to fill the bill, but it might be wise for the voters to cast around and find the right man, for the selection might have to be made in a short length of time later, if necessary at all.
