Stephens' Candidacy Favored

H. C. Stephens of George, who has received the hearty endorsement of the majority of the voters of this part of the county, as a Republican candidate for the Legislature, is gaining many friends in other parts of the county.

Mr. Stephens, while in Oregon City last week, found there a general disposition among not only the candidates for various offices, but among the business and professional people as well, to recognize the right of the eastern part of the county to a representative in the Legislature and the further inclination to regard Mr. Stephens as the choice of the people to represent the eastern section.

Mr. Stephens is too well known locally to need much of an introduction to the voters of this part of the county, being at present president of the East Clackamas County Fair Association and president of the George Commercial & Social Club, in both of which organizations he has always taken an active part.

He has been a taxpayer of Clackamas County for the past seven years and has lived on his present farm at George since 1913. Before coming to Oregon in 1908 he was Cashier of the Interstate Savings Bank in Denver, Colorado and afterward was Vice President of the American National Bank of Pendleton. He has a large acquaintance throughout the State and will make a valuable member of the Legislature. He has adopted as his slogan, "My best efforts for the peoples' interests."
