To date the returns to the Agricultural Department of the P. R. L. & P. Co., of the agricultural forms, which appeared in the News of a couple of weeks ago, have been slightly discouraging, as few farmers have offered the cooperation naturally expected.

While it is probable that the average local land owner is extra busy now or is waiting until the company's representative calls upon him, a few parties have

taken offense at some of the personal questions in the form.

These questions need not be answered unless the party cares to, but it is possible that if full correct information could be obtained dealing with the mortgages and interest rates now current in this section, some remedy may be forthcoming, which will help the securing of future loans at a more reasonable rate than the present predominating 8%.

With the advent last week of another flour and feed business and more livestock buyers in the local fields, it should represent the best of buying and selling opportunities for the farmers.

Last Friday, before Justice Sievers in Oregon City, Fritz Boysen, proprietor of the Hotel Belle of Milwaukie, was convicted of booze selling and sentenced to serve 6 months in jail and pay a fine of \$500.

This conviction and sentence is one of the best pieces of work accomplished by the sheriff and district attorney's office for some time and if Fritz is forced to suffer the full penalty, it will dam-

pen his ardor in freely disregarding the prohibition laws. Yet, the very fact that he did not ask for a jury trial, knowing that an appeal is almost out of the question, looks as though his attorneys are planning to beat justice in some way, probably at the last minute springing a new legal technicality.

Until Boysen is safely in jail, the people of this county cannot rest assured that the prohibition law has been enforced.
