As ever, from many parts of the county, emanating from among the ferns and timber, the words of the old familiar song, "Somebody Lied To Me," are being hummed by late aspiring politicians.

NEWS \$1.50 AFTER AUGUST 1

Announcement is hereby made that the subscription price of the Eastern Clackamas News, on and after August 1st next, will be \$1.50 per year, instead of the present \$1. price.

Owing to the rapid advancement in the prices of every article used in issuing a newspaper, this increase is necessary. In the past three to six months paper stocks have jumped from 10 to 50 percent, with the outlook for even higher prices. Prices in type metals, rubber rollers, inks, colors and the like have in some instances doubled, making it compulsory that the publishers increase their prices accordingly, the same as a merchant constantly does to offset the fluctuations in the market.

With a few exceptions, the dollar per year weekly is a thing of the past, with several Eastern Oregon weekly papers already charging \$2. per year.

The subscription end of the publishing business always represents a loss, as any reader can easily realize when they consider the cost of issuing 52 newspapers and mailing same, for \$1. per year; in other words, issuing a paper at less than 2c per issue.

The News publisher is conceited enough to believe that the Eastern Clackamas News is worth more than the subscription price asked, even at \$1.50 per year, for dozens of subscribers have said so. The News is constantly increasing in the amount of news matter, which it each week disseminates and promises to continue to more clearly devote its interests to the development of Eastern Clackamas County.

Any subscription, whether it expires prior to August 1st or not, may be renewed prior to that date at the present \$1. per year rate and in as much as the Thousand Dollar Voting Contest does not end until August 2nd, votes at the rate of 1,000 for each dollar paid on subscription accounts, will be given.

If a red penciled notation appears in the space below, it means that your subscription has expired recently. The figures, represent the month, day and year.

The publisher does not wish to stop the subscription of anyone who desires to continue the paper, but legally, subscriptions which are not paid in advance, must be stopped, according to the postal rulings.
