Boysen To Escape

Jail Sentence

Despite the hopes of many people and the promises of the authorities, Fritz Boysen, the convicted Hotel Belle booze-peddler, is to escape the heralded jail sentence, which the prosecuting attorney's office and the courts a few weeks ago, promised to give him.

Now the announcement is made that Judge Campbell has allowed the offender to pay the \$500 fine and escape the six months jail sentence, providing he leave Clackamas County and stay away.

This action on the part of Judge Campbell is probably warranted and probably represents the best solution of the case, as Boysen had unlimited financial and legal backing to fight through the courts for months to come.

Boysen is quoted as having claimed to have cleaned up over \$50,000 from his nefarious calling and if the figures were available, it is likely that he and his Milwaukee outfit have cost Clackamas County several thousand dollars in more or less useless prosecutions.

Carl Kimmel of Estacada, who a week or so ago, left for Castle Rock, Oregon to work on an irrigation project, returned home Sunday, where he will remain till after the 4th and as he says "sometime thereafter."

The contract to paint the Estacada school building was awarded to Willis Cox, on a bid of \$312. Work will commence as soon as the weather permits.

Klaetsch's Mill Operating

After several months spent in moving their mill into its new location in Springwater, together with weeks of building and installing machinery, dam, conveyor, etc., the Klaetsch Mill is now in operation.

This mill is one of the largest plants in the county, with a capacity of 30,000 feet per day. The plant will employ fifteen men and is turning out the best of fir and cedar lumber, specializing on dimension materials.

To facilitate the handling of the immense stand of timber adjoining, a 150 foot dam was constructed across a branch of Clear Creek, creating a mill pond of sufficient capacity to handle 1,000,000 feet of timber.
