Third, by saying a good word for the organization whenever it is mentioned. — Since its organization in 1912, the club has expended for lights, library and other civic improvements \$1599.81. When one considers that the regular current expenses are \$25.00 a month, and that this amount must be met regularly summer and winter, he or she can understand more fully the work and worry that such responsibility entails.

The library is being constantly increased, the most recent acquisitions being a thirty-volume edition of Dumas' works, four Alcott books and a biography of Thomas A. Edison which reads like a romance.
