Community Boundaries Established

The directors of the East Clackamas County Fair, announce the following boundaries, as constituting the limits of the several Eastern Clackamas communities, which will exhibit for the community prizes at the coming fair:—

GEORGE DISTRICT—shall include all of the George voting precinct.

GARFIELD DISTRICT—shall include the territory between Eagle Creek and the Clackamas River and lying east of a line running from the Estacada bridge, north along Shafford Avenue to the J. C. Tracy corner; thence up the Wilson Hill to the lane running north from Mrs. Mary Stubbe's place; thence up the lane north, following a direct line to Eagle Creek.

CURRINSVILLE DISTRICT—shall include the territory lying west of the Garfield west line and north of the Clackamas

River, up to Eagle Creek, save and except such territory as lies within the city limits of Estacada.

EAGLE CREEK DISTRICT—shall include the territory north of Eagle Creek and west of the George voting precinct and extending north of the south boundary line of the Barton voting precinct.

BARTON DISTRICT—shall include all of the Barton voting precinct.

SPRINGWATER DISTRICT—shall include all of the Springwater voting precinct and the district commonly known as Elwood.

VIOLA DISTRICT—shall include all of the Viola voting precinct.

LOGAN DISTRICT—shall include all of the Logan voting precinct.

County Training School

From July 31st to August 18th inclusive, the 4th annual Clackamas County Teachers' Training School will be in session in the Barclay School building at Oregon City.

All teachers who expect to teach in Clackamas County this year, and have not had 27 months teaching experience, eight of which in this state, or have not attended a six weeks summer school at one of the state institutions this year, or are not graduates of an accredited normal school, are required under the state school law, to attend.

Three days attendance at this school will be necessary for every teacher who wishes to take advantage of the professional certificate, even though she has taught the necessary time for exemption.

Among the instructors at this session, will be Prin. Guthrie of the Estacada Schools, who has charge of the agricultural work, consisting of an hour of class work per day. Mr. Guthrie has arranged to make the daily trip to and from Estacada on a motorcycle, so should be at home most of the time.
