Grange Raises Over \$25.

On Friday evening a most enjoyable as well as profitable lecture was given at the Garfield Grange Hall by Dr. Walter Nugent of Newburyport, Mass. The subject, "How to Get There" was inspiringly and cleverly handled. In a nutshell the salient points brought out were six—in order to get there we must have purpose, plan, push, principle, perseverance and piety. Each idea was forcibly presented with humorous stories which somehow made it one to be remembered.

It was a rare opportunity for the people in this community to hear an exceptionally good lecturer.

After the lecture Dr. Nugent, whose services were given to the Grange, obtained pledges from those in the audience to the amount of \$25. This money is to be used by the Grange to enlarge their hall to build a more adequate stage and to provide proper exits with doors opening outward, another stairway and other means of safety for men, women and children in case of necessity. More pledges are expected for this excellent safeguarding of lives and it is to be hoped other organizations, not wishing to be outdone by the Garfield community, will take the same steps towards "preparedness."
