HEAS OF MONMOUTH NORMAL SAYS ONE SCHOOL CAINNOT SUTTELY QEMANO FOR TEACH ERS.

Monmouth, Ore-"A careful analysis of the situation will convince any one that Oregon needs a Nornial Schaol in Eastern Oregon and aiso one in Southern Oregon," sald J. H. Ackerman, President of the Sutte Normal School at Monmouth. "It is a Wellestablished fact that a centrully lecated Normal School cannot supply the needs of the eare state The Oregon is readtly pronut by tis anst eursory iuvestigation of the list of our stndents and the list of our gratuate tes ors. The estimated pegalation of our state in 1914 was 795.587 . Take for example the eight Weatarn Orezon cousties, Clatsop. Ciachamas, Benton, Lane, Linn, Marion, I Ih and Yaunt 11 Countics. Their pope ation for 1514
was 214.608 , or less than 27 per ous 214.608 , or less than 27 per cunt yet 50 per cent of the praluates from yet so per cent of the graluates from years are teaching setrool in some one years are teaching sctool in some one ties. There are 35 counties in the state, yet eight of these countios are geting half of the Fenefit of the taachery for which all of the counties pay the tuxes.
Here is the list. During the past fise years we have supplied the fol lowing graduates as teachers to these Clatsop, 18: Clackamas, 20; Ben23: Poik, 25: and Yambill, 20. In other words, 203 of our 407 teachers who tave secured piaces in the public schuols in Oregon during the past five years bave zone to these elght WIIlamette Valiey counties.
Siow take eight typical Eastern Oregon counties and see if they have soeured their proper share of teachers five years we have supplied Normal graduates as foilows to these Lastern Ore on countles: Eaker, 2; Grant. 1; Harney, 4: Mat ho ir. 2; Morrow, 4: Uratii:a, 10 ; Wallowa, 7: and Wheeler, 2 . The eight Whlamette Valley coun thes had 203 Normal teachers as against 39 Normal teachers for the eight Kastern Oregon countles. East aris Oregon recelved less than 10 pe cent as against Western Oregun's fifty yer cent.
