Republican Candidates Speak

Friday night's Republican rally at the Estacada Pavilion, brought out a crowd of about 150 voters, part of whom remained throughout the meeting, but as has happened before, the principal speaker, Hon. B. F. Mulkey of Portland delivered his strong plea for the Republican party, to but a portion of the original audience.

As the Republican candidates for the county offices were allowed to speak first and inasmuch as their declarations occupied the time up to ten o'clock, many of the listeners left the hall before Mr. Mulkey was introduced.

The meeting was conducted by chairman Brodie of the County Republican Committee, with the assistance of Commissioner Mattoon of Estacada.

Six Crates Of Pheasants Liberated

On Saturday evening, six crates of Chinese pheasants were received at Estacada, consigned to the Estacada Rod & Gun Club, R. H. Currin, P. F. Standish, E. E. Saling and Frank Ewing.

The six crates contained seventy-two birds, half male and half female. These young pheasants were raised at the State Game Farm near Corvallis and sent to local parties under the direction of the State Fish & Game Com.

The parties receiving the birds had made formal application for same several months ago and with the exception of the two crates consigned to the Rod & Gun Club, which were liberated on the A. O. Whitcomb and W. R. Reid farms in Garfield, were turned loose on their own properties.
