

**City Budget Accepted  
With Slight Change**

The annual budget meeting of the Estacada road district, held at the City Hall last Monday evening, brought out but a few citizens.

The meeting which was presided over by L. A. Chapman, with R. M. Standish as secretary, openly discussed the various phases of the proposed 10 mill special tax levy, as outlined in the official advertised notice.

The meeting finally voted to call a regular meeting for the voting of a special tax levy, to take place at the City Hall, at 2:00 P. M., November 25th.

The only change made in the budget was that but \$150. should

be expended on the improvement of Second St., between Main St. and Shafford Ave., instead of \$450. as advertised, with the difference being turned into the fund for the taking up of the outstanding warrants.

**Rural Carrier Examination**

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for the County of Clackamas, Oregon, to be held at Oregon City, and Portland on November 25, 1916 to fill the position of rural carrier at Eagle Creek and vacancies that may later occur on rural routes from other post offices in the above mentioned county. The examination will be open only to male citizens who are actually domiciled in the territory of a post office in the county and who meet the other requirements set forth in Form No. 1977. **Pendleton Normal School  
Proven Necessity**

(Copied from Portland Oregonian.)

MONMOUTH, Ore., June 26.—The Oregon Normal school opened this week . . . students enrolled 785, largest on record for state Normal in Oregon . . . how to care for large student body a problem . . . 800 being crowded into auditorium with seating capacity of 550. Galleries filled with extra chairs in aisles. More than 150 students seated on platform. New boarding houses completed, additions to rooming houses built and tents used. One hundred girls sleep on upper floor of school.

The official school report gives 150 grade pupils in Monmouth, for teacher practice.
