Section 104 United States Official Postal Guide

Post office boxes are provided for the convenience of the public in the delivery of mail. Box rent must be paid quarterly in advance. The use of a box is restricted to one individual, family, firm or corporation. The renter of a box may have delivered through it, mail for his family, guests, transients, boarders, employees who are members of his household, and, for a period of thirty days, mail of persons addressed in his care. A box rented by a firm may be used for the delivery of its mail, and by the consent of each member of the firm, the individual mail of each of his household, and of the firm's office employees. A box rented by a corporation, association or society, may be used for mail addressed to it and its officials. Boxes rented by schools, colleges or public institutions, if consistent with the rules and usage thereof, may be used for the delivery of mail addressed to officers, students, employees and inmates.

Section 119. A person receiving mail not intended for him should return it promptly to the post-office for proper disposition. If such mail has been opened by mistake it should be endorsed "Opened by Mistake" with signature of person receiving it.
