Mr. Wentz of Portland, visited a few days at the home of his step-son, George Harrison and on his return, was accompanied by his little grandaugh er Myrtle.


Mrs. Susan Lankin and son of Cle Elum, Wash., is visiting at the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Park.
