District No. 11 (Group I) received out of the General fund \$4,551.05, while its proportion of 70% was \$2,058.76

District No. 47 (Group I) received out of the General fund \$9,525,39, while its proportion was \$5,572.99.

District No. 21 (Group III) received out of the General fund ed geographically. \$1,908.63, while its 70% proportion was \$3,447.47. Also, out of its Special tax, amounting to \$3,693.73, it received but \$2,409,11.

District No. 49 (Group III) received out of the General fund \$1.809.21, while its proportion was \$2,874.56. Also, out of its Special tax of \$5,133.16 it received but \$3,466.90.
