For Peach Leaf Curl Give Early Spraying

Oregon peach growers should complete spraying for peach leaf curl before the end of February, says H. P. Barass, plant pathologist of the O. A. C. Experiment Station.

"To delay the spraying till the buds are coming out may result in failure," said he. "Failure is due as a general thing to a plying the spray too late or without the necessary thoroughness. All the buds must be covered completely, and the tips of every twig reached in order to get perfect control. Look over the trees as the spray dries and see whether you are succeeding in this as well as you supposed."

The best material is Bordeaux mixture 6 6-50, but limesulfur 1-8 is good, and besides will keep down San Jose scale.

Growers are invited to write to the college for spraymaking directions.

Notice To Rural Route Patrons

Between this date and the 1st of March, Rural Mail Carriers will place in the Mail box of each patron on their respective routes, a card or slip of paper for the purpose of obtaining the names of every person above the age of ten years.

The Postmaster is making a directory of each route, and kindly asks of each patron to fill out the card, and place it back in the box. It makes no difference whether you are getting your mail regularly or not, or whether you have made out similar cards before.
