Despite promises made before the legislature adjourned and even since, by the State Fish & Game Commission, to reappoint on May 1st, Ben S. Patton of Estacada, as County Game Warden we are now advised that no such appointment will be made.

The reason assigned being lack of funds. Yet, when we consider that Clackamas County has an income of about \$4,000. per year from the sale of fishing and hunting licenses alone, said income being second only to Multnomah County - and as the cost of such a warden does not exceed \$1500, per year - this false economy is not fair.

When allowance is made for the dozen or more deputy game wardens each season stationed along the Willamette near Oregon City, in enforcing the salmon fishing there - a County Warden is necessary in the balance of the county, for Clackamas has probably as many miles of fishing streams as any in the Northwest and is the mecca of more anglers undoubtedly than any two counties in the state.
